<p>Description: Content will cover US History with Geography from the Pre-Columbian Era to the Constitutional Period.</p> <p>US History will rotate on a three year basis to more fully cover US History from Pre-Columbian to Present day. Students may take US History three years in a row and will learn new information. This class is recommended for grades 7-9. This year's course will cover the period from Pre-Columbian history and geography up to the establishment of the government of the United States. The study of American history will revolve around causes and effects of actions of individuals and nations throughout the time. Colorado state standards will be addressed throughout the course and grades will be based on quizzes, homework assignments and maps. It is expected that students will spend a minimum of one hour per day in preparation for the class. Primary source materials will be used in connection with the text. Students should be reading and writing at, or above grade level in order to enroll in this class. Students will be encouraged to engage in class discussion. Study skills, writing skills and logical argumentation will also be stressed in addition to learning the history of the era.</p>

<p>Description: Content will cover US History with Geography from the Constitutional Era to the Reconstruction Period.</p> <p>US History will rotate on a three year basis to more fully cover US History from Pre-Columbian to Present day. Students may take US History three years in a row and will learn new information. This class is recommended for grades 7-9. Students may take this course in any order. This is the second of three courses designed to break the study of American History into three time periods. US History Part 1 covered the time span from pre-Columbian history through the Revolutionary period. US History Part 2 picks up where US History Part 1 left off: beginning with the Constitutional period and finishing in the Reconstruction (Post Civil War) period. Study will revolve around causes and effects of actions of individuals and nations during this time. Colorado state standards will be addressed and grades will be based on quizzes, homework assignments, and maps. Primary source materials will be used in connection with the text. Students should be reading and writing at or above e level to enroll in this class. Students will be encouraged to engage in classroom discussion. Study skills, writing skills and logical argumentation will also be stressed as part of the course.</p>

World History is recommended for grades 10th and 11th. Students may take this course in any order. This course covers the period of time from the Post European Renaissance to the present. Study will revolve around causes and effects of actions of individuals and nations during this time. Colorado state standards will be addressed and grades will be based on quizzes, homework assignments, scored discussions, and maps. Primary source materials will be used to supplement the district's text. Students should be reading and writing at or above grade level to enroll in this class. Students will be encouraged to engage in classroom discussion. Study skills, writing skills and logical argumentation will also be stressed as part of the course.</p>

<p>Description: This middle school level science class covers and integrates a wide range of hands-on experiences, critical-thinking opportunities, and real-world applications. (note: Amber is trying to get connected with a career testing center to allow students to assess their skills and receive feedback on jobs which may be a good fit in their future.)</p>

<p>Description: Students will learn to use the periodic table to identify characteristics specific to each element. Using this information students will develop a fuller understanding of the laws pertaining to the transfer of energy and matter during a reaction. Students will be able to identify reactants and products from equations and identify if the equations are balanced. Students will learn the hows and whys about the basic chemistry that is observed daily. (examples why does steel wool rust so quickly when it gets wet, how do instant heat and cold packs work, how does ice melt work, matches light after striking) We will also learn about the basic behavior of atoms and molecules.</p> <p>Please note: This is a Fundamentals of Chemistry class. This will not have a chemistry code on your APS transcripts. This is to give an accurate reflection of the content the student is learning and not to confuse a college into thinking your student has had a full chemistry class. Options can not provide a full chem class due to the fact that we do not have showers, or ventilation or eye wash stations, etc. Students will learn important chemistry concepts through book work and hands-on basic labs. This will give them a solid foundation for taking chemistry classes in college, and meeting those vigorous demands, without feeling overwhelmed. For those who are not college-bound, this will be a great and fun advanced science class.</p>

Description: Composition 1 will focus on developing the basics of writing with organization, voice, style, and audience awareness. Students will learn to follow the 5 basic steps of the writing process: prewriting, drafting, revising, editing and publishing as well as use the opportunity to share their work and become comfortable with peer review and critiquing. Writing projects will range in style and genre with a specific focus on each of the 6 + 1 writing traits. Classes will include a focus on strengthening spelling and grammar skills to ensure students become proficient with written language without the use of spell or grammar check. Assignments will include persuasive essays, research papers and short stories. Student motivation will be propelled by empowering students to develop questions about topics that interest them, to defend their opinions and ideas with research based evidence, to discover and research new passions, and to see themselves as real-world writers.

Its purpose is to enable students to successfully create covers of their favorite groups, participate seamlessly in local praise-and-worship bands, and be confident in a solo and small group vocal setting. It will strive to train and shape the maturity of the singing voice and will develop the singer's melodic interpretation and harmonic potential.</p> <p>Traditional music focuses on integrating and exploring various aspects of vocal music performance. From choral literature to original songwriting; from a cappella singing to accompanied; this is the class for those who love to sing! Music-reading, pitch-matching and ear-training, and identifying written notes with those on a keyboard are skills that will be developed and emphasized throughout the year and are not necessary to enroll in the class.
